## Vladimir Kuprivanov Cast me not away from your presence

Opening Thursday 2 October 2008 at 18.30; the exhibition will run to 8 November 2008. Catalogue with critical text by Viktor Misiano.

Laura Bulian Gallery will inaugurate a new space in Milan at via Montevideo 11, with a solo exhibition by the Russian photo-artist Vladimir Kupriyanov.

This gallery began its activity in Moscow in May 2008 with the exhibition "The Returns of the Form", as part of the Moscow Art Fair, in collaboration with RAM radioartemobile, Rome; the critical concept was devised by Viktor Misiano.

In his photo-installations, Vladimir Kupriyanov strengthens the mythological nature of the image while preserving its narrative and documentary form; by establishing contact with the sensual and existential features of human life he reestablishes the right to attribute value to pathos. The artist explores history and the flow of time; he revives age-old images instilling a new life into them. He creates documentary images in a language where the object portrayed defines the beginning and the end. His unique formal technique - print on film - aims at revealing the essence of the image, bringing out its absolute purity. Moreover, this technique seeks the plastic dimension of photography.

"In photography I see myself as a director; I stage the plastic elements of the image. I represent historical situations in my photographs which are closely linked either with Russian life or Russian history. I lend them a new spatial and temporal dimension by transferring them onto glass, film or plexiglas". Vladimir Kupriyanov

The work which gives its title to the exhibition, "Don't cast me away from your presence", refers to the Biblical Psalm that is also quoted in Russian below the photo.

This exhibition, which opens on 2 October, will present some of the artist's most recent photographic works. The artist and Viktor Misiano will be present at the opening.

Vladimir Kupriyanov was born in 1954 in Moscow where he lives and works. Apart from photography, he also has worked as a theatre director. He is associate professor of artistic photography at the Rodchenko Moscow School of Photography and Media Arts.
